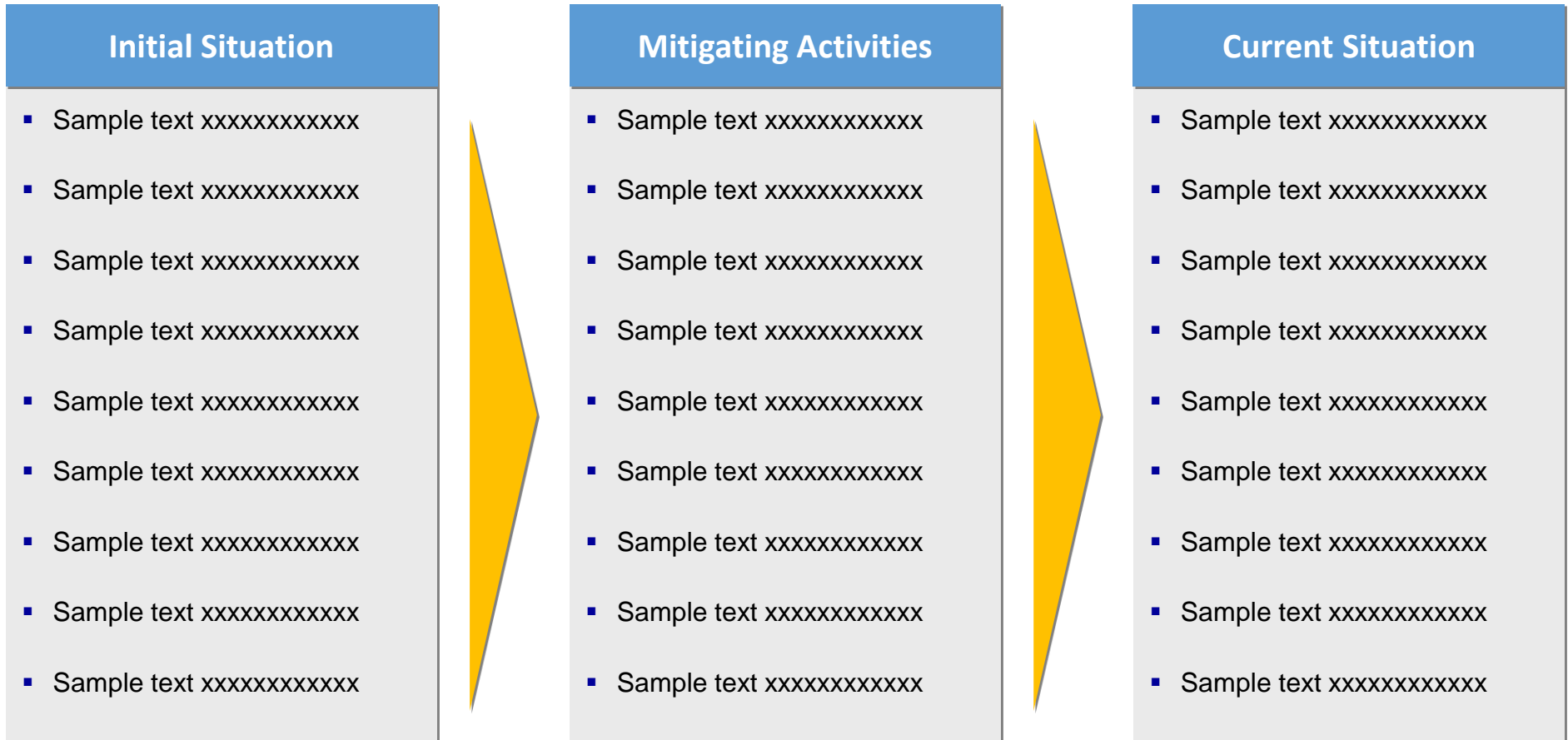

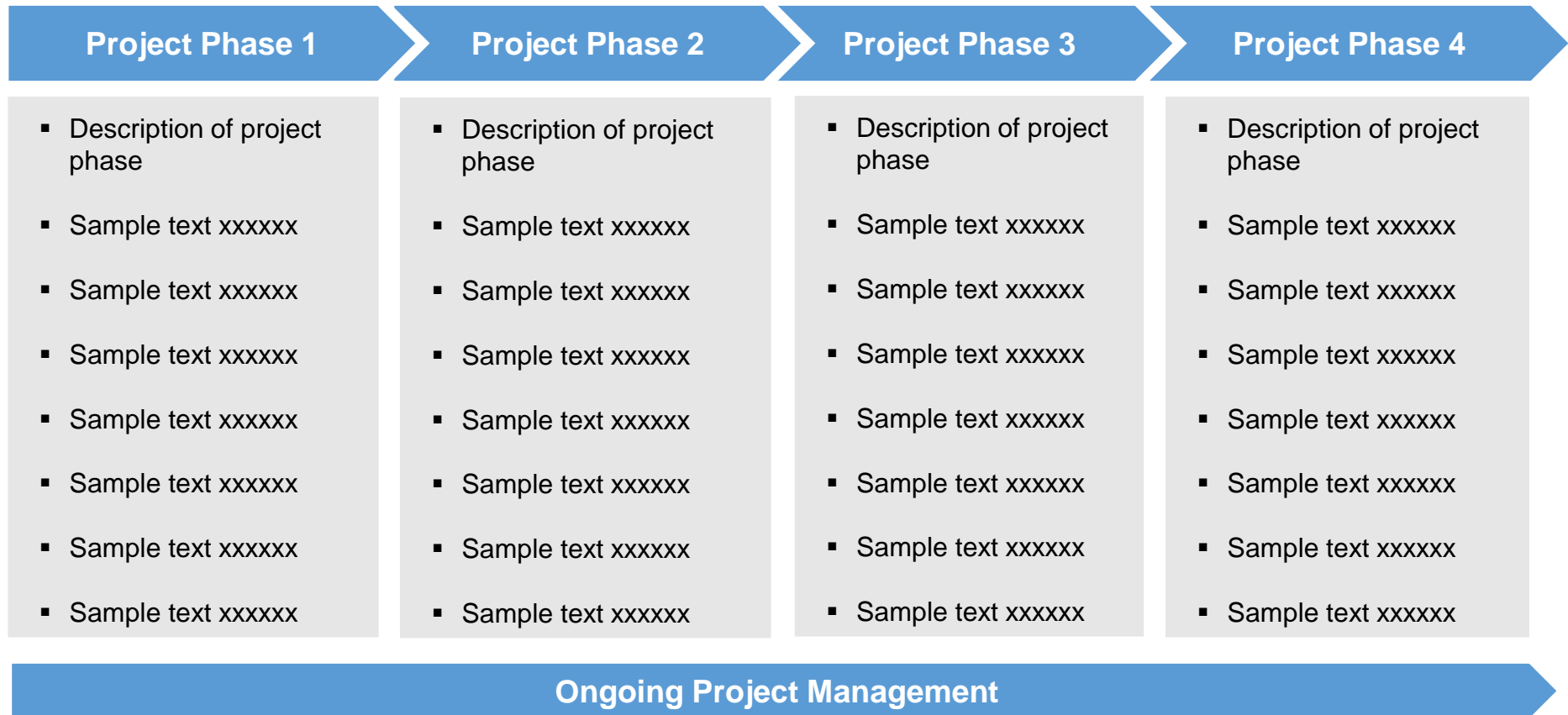
Simple: Using shapes to illustrate the (evolutionary) relation between three text boxes

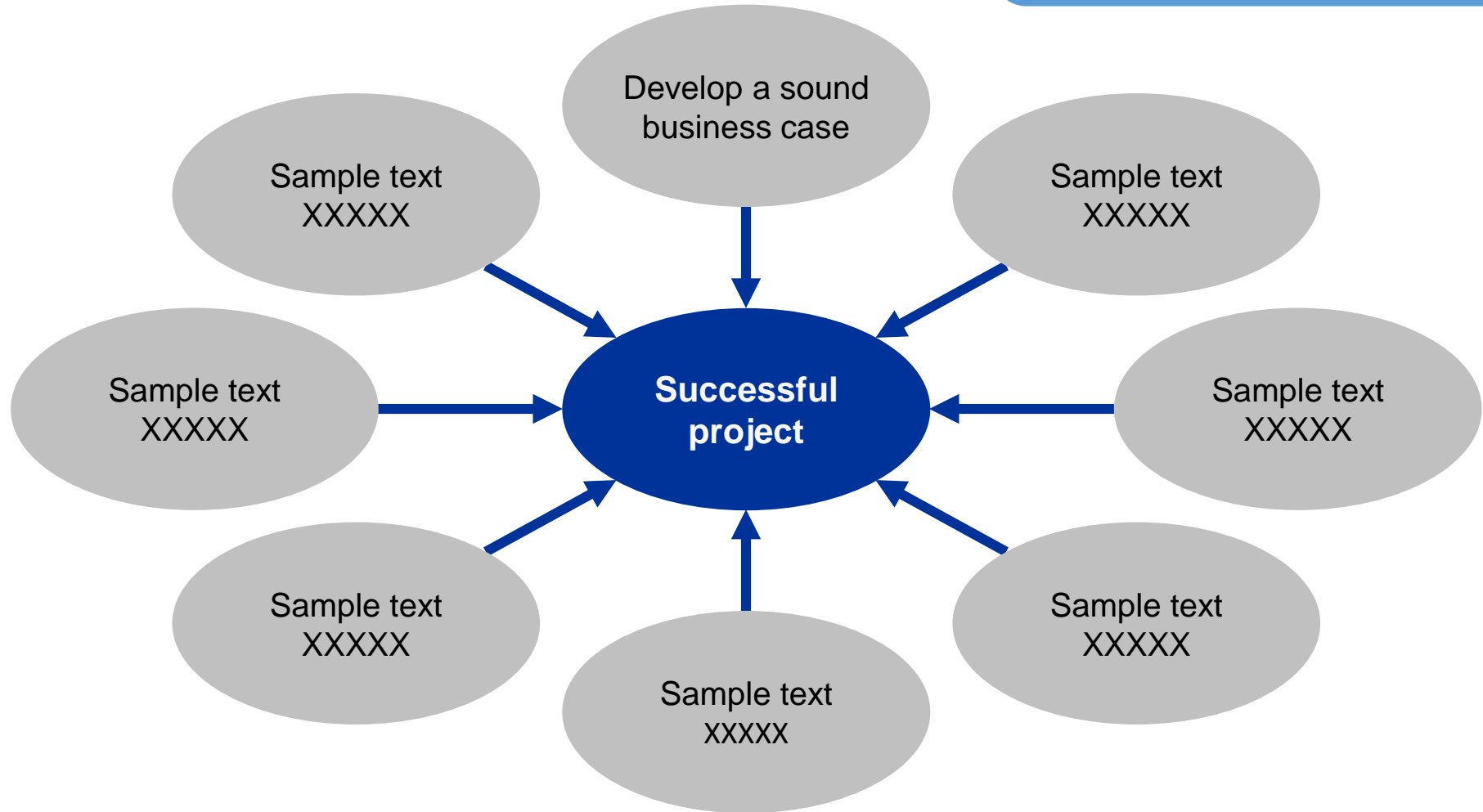
Medium: Using chevrons and boxes to illustrate the course of a project or process

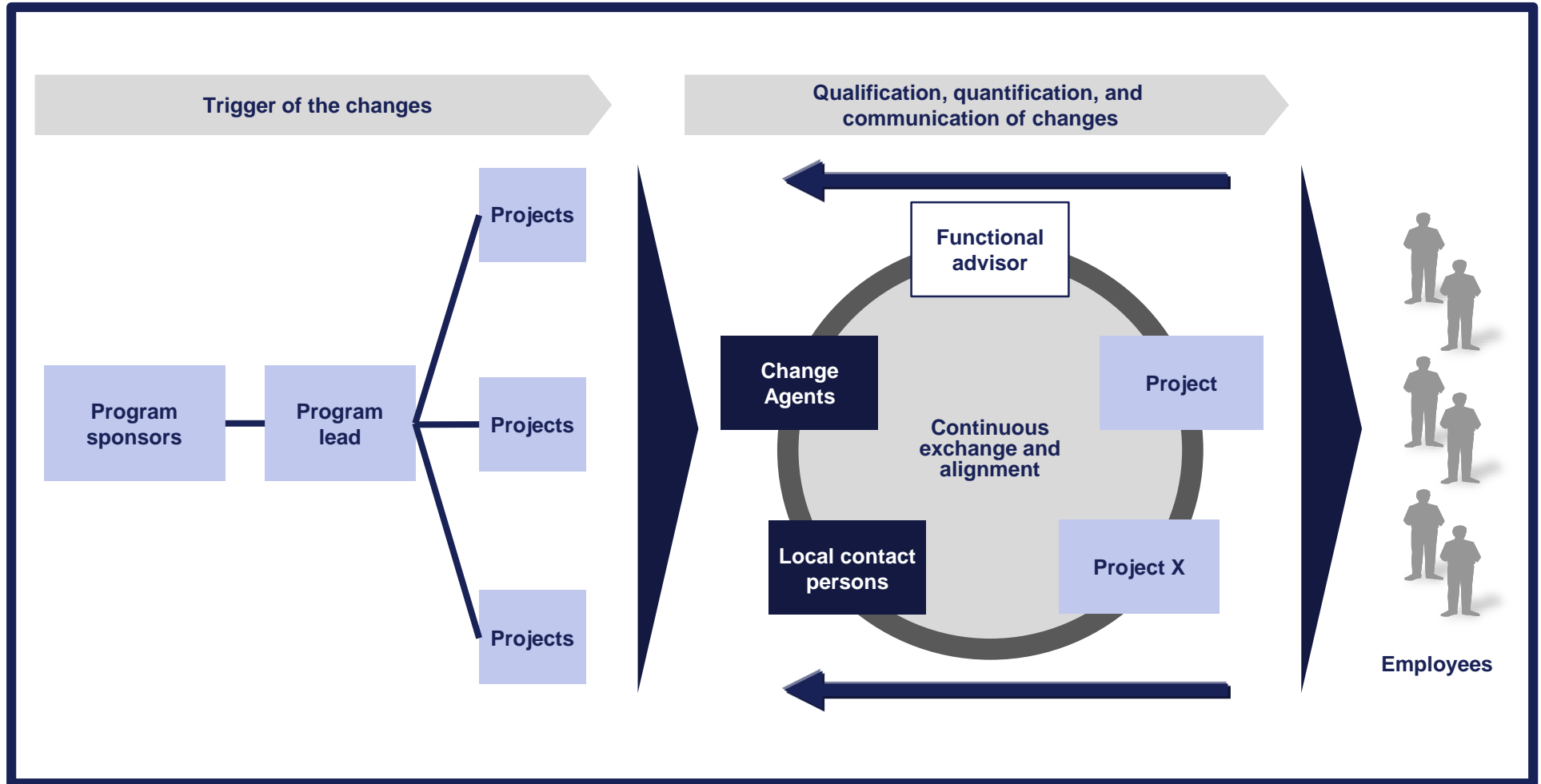
Medium: Using ovals to illustrate influencing factors / requirements

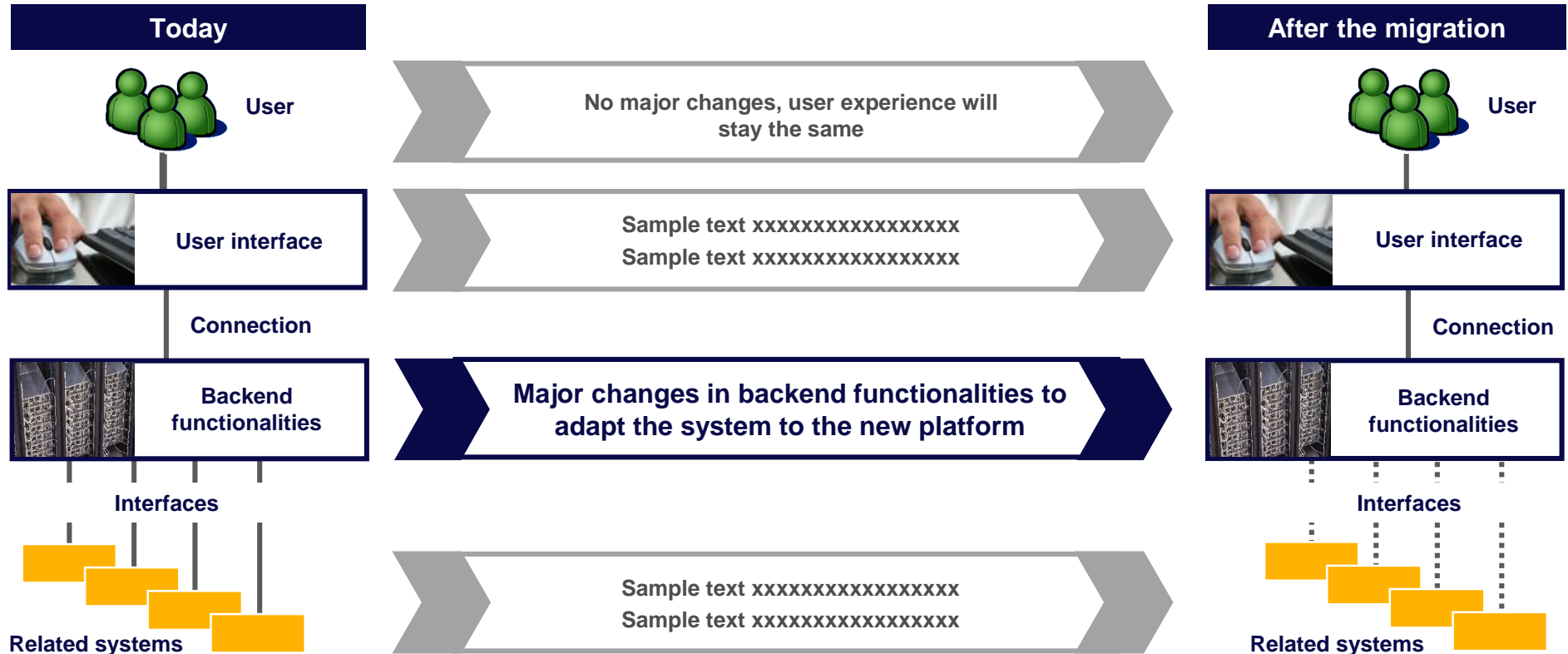
